

Marthe Robin and the Foyers of Charity, by Martin Blake

arthe Robin and the Foyers of Charity looks at the life of Marthe Robin, the French mystic, who, with Fr Georges Finet, co-founded the Foyer of Charity community at Châteauneuf-de-Galaure in southeastern France in 1936. There are now 75 Foyer communities throughout the world, and their work involves a priest, the Father of the Foyer, giving 5 day retreats in silence, during which the members of the community look after the needs of the retreatants and pray for them.

Marthe Robin and the Foyers of Charity is paperback-soft-cover, Demy Octavo size (8.5 in. x 5.5 in.), has 13 chapters, and 160 pages. It costs £7.95 / \$11.95 / 8.95 euros, (approx. £10 incl. p & p if ordered online) ISBN 9780955074622




